3. Mark Hamill

Despite most frequently being associated with the hero of the *Star Wars* franchise, Luke Skywalker, Mark Hamill landed the role of the Joker in Warner Bros' "*Batman: The Animated Series*" with his exceptional acting abilities. Hamill's voice is the most recognizable of all actors who have portrayed the Joker, as he voiced the character for nearly 25 years. In particular, his iconic deranged and horrifying laugh perfectly embodies the villain's insanity and dark sense of humor. Throughout Hamill's 25-year role as the Joker, he sustained the Batman villain's balance between a complete clown and murderous psychopath, which adds to the allure of Hamill's version of the sadistic criminal.

2. Jack Nicholson

His performance captivated audiences and perhaps even overshadowed Michael Keaton's performance of the movie's titular character.

1. Heath Ledger

Heath Ledger's portrayal of the Joker in Christopher Nolan's *The Dark Knight*, the second installment of *The Dark Knight Trilogy*, is easily the most chilling and terrifying performance of the anarchist mastermind. Ledger's Oscar® worthy performance is frequently noted by critics as being the leading and most definitive rendition of the Joker, as he flawlessly captures the villain's pure insanity and sociopathic nature. Unlike the many other portrayals of the Joker, Ledger's version of the character is actually not funny -- at all. Rather, he is entirely cruel and evil as he takes joy in torturing the innocent (e.g., when he implanted an explosive in a man's stomach). Lastly, Ledger's chilling one-liner "Why so serious?" and its origin story help deliver an all the more mesmerizing and haunting performance for audiences to rave over.
